Treasurer Report: Allison Arnold was absent from the May meeting. The financials are current at a budget of \$13,566.34. The fireworks budget has improved with donations from the Lincoln County Tourism of \$9,000.00 and Tim Anderson with \$1,000.00.

Other Business: Jake attended the Golf Gala and raised \$16,000.00 to host a successful gala. The Chamber has increased memberships at 3-4 businesses. Veterans for a Better Community has worked hard to have a successful 4th of July planning time. There will be a dunk tank, concessions, axe throwing. Linn with Pinbowl Alley will be hosting a 4th of July end of season bowling tournament on June 27th. It will be an open/mixed age tournament. Limon Rotary Club is looking to help with a raffle license for the tournament. The funds raised will be donated to the Fireworks' fund for next years' event. Donna Metcalf has supplies for colored water gun fight. Jake will talk with Alison to organize that and pin down times for all the activities. Car show committee still needs to meet. Monica wondered if the vendors could be closer to the cars. Raejean said we also need to keep the local businesses in mind for the car show. Moving the vendors to the park left Hoffman off the map and they have discontinued their sidewalk sale. We also have some restaurants downtown that we could highlight during the car show.
